Kyasanur Forest Disease

Karnataka state, India, which also affected wild nonhuman primates. Collection of samples from dead animals and the use of classical virological techniques led to the isolation of a previously unrecognized virus, named Kyasanur forest disease virus (KFDV), which was found to be related to the Russian spring-summer encephalitis (RSSE) complex of tick-borne viruses. Further evaluation found that KFD, which frequently took the form of a hemorrhagic syndrome, differed from most other RSSE virus infections, which were characterized by neurologic disease. Its association with illness in wild primates was also unique. Hemaphysalis spinigera was identified as the probable tick vector. Despite an estimated annual incidence in India of 400-500 cases, KFD is historically understudied. Most of what is known about the disease comes from studies in the late 1950s and early 1960s by the Virus Research Center in Pune, India and their collaborators at the Rockefeller Foundation. A report in ProMED in early 2012 indicated that the number of cases of KFD this year is possibly the largest since 2005, reminding us that there are significant gaps in our knowledge of the disease, including many aspects of its pathogenesis, the host response to infection and potential therapeutic options. A vaccine is currently in use in India, but efforts could be made to improve its long-term efficacy.




Specific Treatments: Omlonti® (omidenepag isopropyl ophthalmic solution) 0.002% for the reduction of elevated intraocular pressure (IOP) in patients with primary open-angle glaucoma or ocular hypertension.

Mechanism of Action

Omidenepag is a relatively selective EP2 receptor agonist which decreases intraocular pressure (IOP). The exact mechanism of action is unknown at this time. Elevated IOP represents a major risk factor for glaucomatous field loss. The higher the level of IOP, the greater the likelihood of optic nerve damage and visual field loss.

Side Effects

Conjunctival hyperemia, photophobia, vision blurred, dry eye, instillation site pain, eye pain, ocular hyperemia, punctate keratitis, headache, eye irritation, and visual impairment.



Less Known Facts about Traditional Food PUMPKIN FLOWER FRITTERS

Squash blossoms called courgette flowers in Great Britain are the edible flowers of Cucurbita species. Though it contains a low amount of calories and fat per serving, pumpkin flower can help boost your intake of several important nutrients, including fiber, copper, folate, and vitamin A. Pumpkin flower is particularly rich in copper, an essential mineral that your body needs for energy production. It also contains a good amount of folate per serving, which is a B vitamin that plays a key role in protein metabolism and DNA synthesis .Additionally, pumpkin flowers provide approximately 13% of your DV for vitamin A, which supports the formation and function of the heart, eyes, and lungs.

Recipe: Remove the stems and stigma of the flowers. Wash and clean properly. In a bowl add gram flour, rice flour, turmeric powder, red chilli powder, salt and add water and make a semi thick batter. Add hot oil and mix again. Separately heat oil for frying in a pan. When oil start smoking that means it is hot enough then reduce the heat to medium. Take two flowers at a time. Dip these into the batter and put it in heated oil. Cook in medium flame until all sides are golden brown, with the spatula take them out of the oil and place them in a plate.

Morphology:

Sapindus is medium-to-large size, deciduous tree and few species of Sapindus exist as shrub too. This tree is an important forest tree species. Generally, Sapindus tree usually grows up to a height of 12–25 m, but sometimes it attains a height 18–35 m with 1.8 m girth; however, height of tree differs in various species. The bark of this plant is dark to pale yellow, fairly smooth, having many vertical lines of lenticels and fine fissures exfoliating in irregular wood scales. Leaves are compound, 30–50 cm long. Flowers are about 5 mm across. Seeds are globose, smooth, black and loosely present in dry fruit. During ripening, fruit colour changes from yellow orange to dark brown. **Chemical Composition:**

The main chemical constituents of the soapberry pericarp are terpenoids (especially triterpenoid saponins and sesquiterpenoid glycosides), phenylpropanoids, steroids, and saccharides.

Uses:

Ritha fruit used as Prevents contraception, Hysteria, Heals Psoriasis and Eczema, Prevents Dandruff, Helps in preventing bad habits, Treats Asthma, Stops hair fall, Anti-Venom, Tumor Cells, Smooth blood circulation, Treats Hair Split Ends, Face Wash, Prevents many skin related Diseases, Fight against Skin and Scalp infections.
