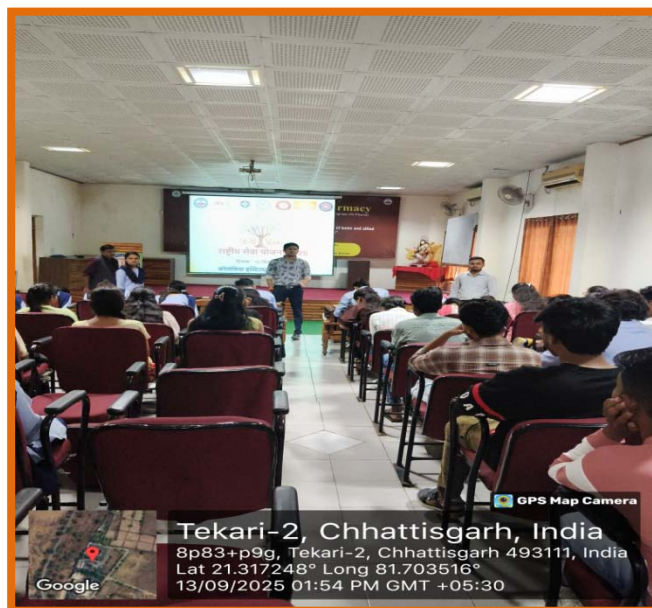

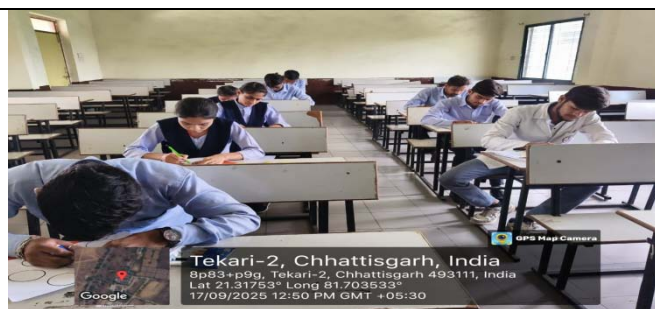
Engineer's Day

Spirulina: A Superfood

Spirulina are filamentous, multicellular, blue-green microalgae that are classified into two different genera. There are roughly 15 species of Arthrospira and Spirulina. The majority of published studies and public health decisions refer to Arthrospira platensis, the most prevalent and accessible spirulina. It has a notably high level of macro- and micronutrients, grows in water, and is easily harvested and processed. Because of its high protein content (50–60%), antioxidants, vital fatty acids, and other nutrients, spirulina is widely utilized as a nutritional supplement all over the world. Spirulina protein has a higher amino acid content than soy beans, making it one of the best in the plant kingdom. Spirulina is now regarded as a "superfood."

Its production methods, nutrient and bioactive component richness, therapeutic qualities in health food circuits, and adaptability in a range of food supplements are all thoroughly explained. We provide information on all potential Spirulina platensis fortification options, with a focus on raising nutrient levels in bread goods, drinks, dairy products, extruded snacks, energy bars, baby food, and confections. Furthermore, while growing in alkaline and saline water, these algae transform carbon dioxide into organic compounds and generate oxygen, preventing the waste of fresh water and enabling production in arid regions. An organism with so many health benefits for people, animals, and the environment is boundless and likely will continue to do so in the future.

Pumpkin Leaves Stir Fried

Recipe: Wash pumpkin leaves with stems under running water. With the help of a sharp knife gently remove the thorns. Finely chop the pumpkin leaves and cut the stems in 2" long. In a pan heat oil. Add chopped garlic. Add pumpkin stems first. Fry for 2-3 minutes as pumpkin stems may require more time to cook than its leaves. Add chopped green chillies and chopped pumpkin leaves. Add salt. Cook till pumpkin leaves and stems become soft and tender by covering the pan in low heat. Remove from heat. Serve as a side dish with steamed rice.
